On May 14th, the Kansas City Chapter of BOMA; (Building Owners & Managers Association), held their annual Client/ Vendor EXPO - at Union Station in Kansas City, Missouri. We are proud to announce that Allegiance Security Group, LLC was well-represented and because our booth was one of the 1st confirmed, we were provided with prime-placement at the front of the great hall of this historically-significant site. This year's event had its largest turnout ever, and consisted of over 200 Exhibitors with booths, and over 400 potential clients in attendance. Earlier this Quarter, Bob Krebs, the Kansas City Branch Manager, participated as a Judge in the BOMA/TOBY Building Competition - (Building Owners & Managers Association / The Office Building of the Year). This is a long-standing competition among building owners, which is much-like the annual "Oscar" awards ceremony in the Movie Industry - as each building owner/management team enters their building(s) into the competition, and are graded on a large volume of judging/indices; such as: Architectural Design, Security of the Building, "Green" participation, Employee Amenities, Public Ingress/Egress, Community Impact, Safety, Inter-Office Design, and overall appearance. They essentially offer up their buildings to be graded and judged in these categories and are awarded points as they are assessed in each of these areas. The eventual winners in each of the categories - (which are based on their size in sq/ft - ex =- 200,000 square feet to 400,000 square feet category, Best "Restored" Building, Best

"New" Building, etc..) – are then awarded the prize for their "Division", which is a very handsome Crystal Obelisk, with their Building Name and Team Information engraved into it, AND most-importantly, this places their building at the TOP of the register for clients looking for "Prime Focus" building/space in which to house their offices or company. So, the more TOBY awards these buildings receive, the more "bankable" they become - as a site for new business looking for the BEST space and placement in a particular City. Bob acted as a Judge; along with 6 other representatives from various other agencies - (property management companies, vendors, ASIS participants), and was not only a Judge for the Local/Regional competition, but also acted as an International Judge - (online judging) for the final competition in late May. This is Bob's 4th year to act as a BOMA/TOBY Judge, and our participation in this also provides us with direct-segue and access to potential Allegiance Security Group clients for the future.
